My company submitted a bid for the above contract.

Based on review of the bids, my company protests any award to Spiniello Companies, the lowest numerical bidder, for the following reasons.

First, the bid by Spiniello Companies named Collazo Contractors, Inc. as its MBE for excavating, equipment rental and cleaning of water mains to comply with the MBE goal of 12% of the total bid amount. In addition to the work on site, Spiniello also stated that Collazo Contractors. Inc. would be supplying pipe, valves and fittings. Collazo is a non-manufacturing supplier. The value for this material should exceed \$2,200,000. There was no breakdown of how much of the MBE commitment would be for excavating, etc. and how much would be for materials supplied, even though bidders were instructed by a representative of the Minority and Woman's Business Opportunity Office at the pre-bid meeting on April 8, 2009 to properly complete the M/WBE Statement of Intent forms, and failure to do so could result in a rejection of the bid. Based on a breakdown with material at \$2,200,000.00, the commitment amount of 12% of the bid would be substantially reduced because materials from non-manufacturing suppliers can only count toward 25% of the MBE goal.

Second, in the Special Conditions, SC-2, bidders were instructed to include a letter as part of their bid or proposal under Article 5 § 29-16. I have been advised that, upon reviewing all of the bidders' documents, it appears that J. Fletcher Creamer & Son, Inc. was the only bidder to comply with this requirement which required time and effort for compliance. The other bidders appear to have avoided the cost of that effort.

For the above reasons, the bid from Spiniello Companies is non-responsive and should be rejected.

My company will be harmed if an award is made to the lowest numerical bidder instead of my company since the bid submitted by my company complies in all material respects with the instructions to bidders issued by the City and is within the advertised budget of \$10M to \$15M. In addition, our MBE and WBE subcontractors listed in our bid have complied with the regulations and laws of the City of Baltimore and will also be harmed by losing the opportunity to perform their work.

RE: Bid Protest Fallsway Housing Bureau of General Services Contract PB08820

We would like congratulate the city on successfully "auctioning" the Fallsway project and sullying the integrity of the competitive bid process. Rebidding this project for a minor technicality on a bid form is inconsistent with any legal precedent we were able to uncover. In Massman Construction Co. V United States, the courts opined that public exposure of bids without award compromised the competitive system. Furthermore, sufficient reasons for rejecting all bids would be for compelling reasons such as the services are no longer being required or for a lack of funds. The city's position that MBE forms were completed incorrectly by all bidders would not seem to fit into the category of "sufficient". The fact of the matter is that completing those forms for a nine month schedule or a twelve month schedule would not have any impact on the amount of MBE/WBE participation, which is ultimately the goal of the process.

What the city managed to accomplish by rebidding, was to squander the hard work and research of our company in preparing our initial bid. Allowing the other bidders to see our exact bid price, our named vendors/ and subcontractors prior to a second bid is ultimately like cheating during an exam or copying another's homework. How would you explain a contractor bidding the exact same project on two occasions with two different bid prices and the second significantly lower? I believe the answer is that he had the advantage of knowing the bid price and vendors on the second occasion. A very clear example is that the apparent low bidder lowered his price several hundred thousand dollars on the re-bid and named our proposed vendor on his second bid and not his initial bid.

We believe that in the most recent bid, all bidders' submissions excepting ours were incomplete as not all the required forms were completed or were completed incorrectly. I write on behalf of my client, Roy Kirby & Sons, Inc., in regards to the bidding process for the Fallsway Housing and Service Center ("Fallsway Center"). Specifically, I wish to respond to the July 1, 2009 letter of Michael Shacklette on behalf of Michael Group Inc. in which he questions the integrity of that bidding process and claims that the re-bidding "sull[ied] the integrity of the competitive bid process." Contrary to that contention, it is clear that re-bidding was necessary due to multiple flaws in each of the original bidding applications. In light of these repeated errors, the Baltimore City Board of Estimate's decision to re-bid the Fallsway Center project was proper. The Board of Estimates adhered to the provisions of both the Maryland Code and the Baltimore City Charter concerning government procurement and the right to address procedural errors in a bidding procedure.

The Maryland Code specifically addresses the right to reject flawed bids in the context of government procurement, stating that "[i]f, with approval of the Board, a unit determines that it is fiscally advantageous or otherwise in the best interests of the State, the unit may: . . . (2) reject all bids or proposals." MD. CODE ANN., STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT § 13-206(b)(2). Further, MD. CODE ANN., STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT § 13-206(b)(2). Further, MD. CODE ANN., STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT § 13-103(3) provides that "[a]fter competitive sealed bids have been opened, a procurement officer may award a procurement contract on the basis of revised bids if: (1) all bids are rejected under § 13-206 of this title; . . . or (3) with approval of the head of the unit or a designee, the procurement officer determines that all bids are unreasonable as to at least 1 requirement . . ." This is consistent with the Baltimore City Charter which notes that "[a]fter opening the bids, the Board of Estimates shall award the contract . . . or shall reject all bids." BALT. CTY CHARTER, ART. VI, § 11(g)(ii).

In this instance, the Baltimore City Board of Estimates recognized material errors in each of the originallysubmitted bids. Rather than ignoring those errors and attempting to proceed despite flaws in the original process, the Board of Estimates followed the statutorily-prescribed process to re-bid the Fallsway Center project. Mr. Shacklette has chosen to ignore this fact and instead has alleged unsubstantiated ulterior



motives. There is no reason to believe that the re-bidding process was intended to convey an unfair advantage upon other parties.

Mr. Shacklette's real argument is with the City's procurement process. He contends that it is unfair for original bids to be made public prior to a re-bidding process. This contention has little merit. In *Hess Const. Co. v. Board of Educ. Of Prince George's Cty*, 341 Md. 155, 669 A.2d 1352 (Md. 1996), the Maryland Court of Appeals addressed a petitioner's argument that "the goals of competitive bidding are defeated if a public body, after the bids are opened and announced, is permitted to reject all bids and call for re-bidding after the low bid is known." *Id.* at 170-71, 669 A.2d at 1359. The Maryland Court of Appeals ruled against the petitioner's argument, finding that the process was legal and that any policy change of this nature would need to come from a legislative body. *Id.* at 171, 669 at 1359.

Not stated in Mr. Shacklette's letter is that he too had access to all the original bids. In other words, he was privy to the underpinnings of all other bidders and could have used that information to improve his revised bid. In fact, he lowered his bid in his re-submittal and did not complain as he lowered his bid that it was unfair to review the other bids.

In light of these facts, Roy Kirby & Sons, Inc. asks that the Board of Estimates reject the theories propounded by Mr. Shacklette. They amount to little more than "sour grapes" and do not provide a legal basis to overturn the legitimate results of a statutorily-prescribed procurement process. The Board of Estimates acted properly under both the Maryland Code and the Baltimore City Charter and the results of the Fallsway Center re-bidding should be upheld.
