BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

The City of Baltimore's Department of General Services is seeking a financial advisory firm to assist the Fiscal Services Division in managing internal service fund rates, capturing total cost of ownership (for buildings and motor vehicles), and advising on fund stewardship (to include optimizing revenue potential). We requested proposals from firms with experience in developing and managing financial models, producing financial forecasts, and providing asset management advisory services. We sought a firm that can provide us with the following services:

- Developing rate models that inform internal service/enterprise funds;
- Projecting internal service fund costs based on service expectations;
- Calculating total cost of ownership for real property assets;
- Calculating total cost of ownership for motor vehicle assets;
- Forecasting capital project costs to inform budget planning, recapping and reconciliation;
- Developing a process to have a monthly review of revenue.

The term of this Agreement will commence on approval of the Board of Estimates and will terminate twenty-four (24) months from the date of Board approval, unless terminated sooner, in accordance with this Agreement. At the sole option of the City, this Agreement may be extended for three (3) additional (1) year periods with the compensation to the Consultant in any option year to be governed by pricing as elucidated in Exhibit A of the agreement.

The Department of General Services (DGS) was approved by the citizens of Baltimore in the November 2008 General Election and began operations as an independent agency on July 1, 2009. DGS is comprised of five divisions: Administration, Fleet Management, Facilities Management, Public and Private Energy Performance, and Capital Projects Division/Design and Construction. DGS is committed to providing healthy work environments and safe, reliable vehicles for City employees by delivering customer service to City agencies, that serve Baltimore's community members and stakeholders.

DGS' Fleet Management Division is responsible for purchasing, outfitting, fueling, maintaining, and decommissioning vehicles and other equipment used by 29 City agencies. Operations take

place at the Central Garage and eight substations throughout the City. Teams of highly-trained technicians maintain over 5,200 pieces of motorized equipment, including police cruisers, fire apparatus, Inner Harbor water skimmers, lawnmowers, and more. Fleet Management serves as the City's subject matter expert on vehicles and equipment and advises on environmental legislation and sustainability efforts.

DGS' Facilities Management Division is responsible for providing maintenance and repair to over 500 municipal buildings. The 82 core buildings, owned by the Mayor and City Council, comprise over 4.7 million square feet of workspace. Tenant agencies include most departments of City government, private and non-profit groups, and other governmental and quasi-governmental entities. The service maintains 57 buildings through an Internal Service Fund (ISF), including Historic Properties. Agencies occupying buildings supported by the ISF are charged rent on a per-square-foot basis. The service also manages surplused schools, which are supported through the General Fund. DGS is actively engaged with partners to identify opportunities for alternative uses for the surplused schools.

In furtherance of Mayor Brandon Scott's efforts to streamline the sale of city-owned property and improve customer experience, the Department of Housing & Community Development (DHCD) has conducted a comprehensive review of its existing sales processes. As a result of this review, the agency has developed a policy that aims to reduce the timeframe for processing sales of city-owned property which can range from 180 to 365 days down to 90 days by creating a fixed pricing policy for properties that meet specific criteria.

CREATE A FIXED PRICING DISPOSITION POLICY FOR PROPERTIES THAT MEET SPECIFIC CRITERIA

After reviewing the sales data of the last five years and conducting a survey of how several municipalities manage the sale of City-owned property, DHCD proposes a fixed pricing policy for certain City-owned vacant buildings and lots in neighborhoods with stressed housing markets. Fixed pricing will increase transparency and streamline our disposition process in the city's stressed neighborhoods, which are the most impacted by vacant properties. This will eliminate the need for protracted price negotiations for the majority of DHCD's inventory of vacant properties, allowing these sales to move through our process much quicker. Adopting this model will also allow DHCD to advertise accurate pricing for these properties online so that interested buyers can make more informed decisions when selecting properties.

The fixed pricing program will only apply to properties located within Baltimore City's Housing Market Typology categories E-J and will be limited to up to 12 properties per application. Applicants cannot apply for additional properties under this program until the first 12 properties are completed. All vacant building sales must be for redevelopment for residential use or mixed use with residential. Please refer to the following chart for pricing information and additional criteria:

On or about September 13, 2021, St. Michael's Media, Inc. ("Plaintiff") filed a lawsuit against the City seeking, inter alia, a preliminary injunction and monetary damages for alleged First Amendment violations related to the City's purported actions leading to the cancellation of a rally planned to take place on November 16, 2021, at the City-owned, but privately managed, MECU Pavilion. Plaintiff also seeks relief under 42 U.S.C. §1983, including attorney's fees. The City raised security concerns about the post-January 6 planned rally. The U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland granted Plaintiff's request for a preliminary injunction; the Fourth Circuit affirmed that ruling. This settlement considers the cost of further litigation in proceeding to trial. The amount sought to settle this matter is less than a quarter of the alleged attorney's fees and costs expended by Plaintiff thus far.

After a mediation, the Plaintiff agreed to settle its claims against the City for the amount designated above and returned an executed settlement agreement.

Based on a review by the Settlement Committee of the Law Department, a recommendation is made to the Board of Estimates to approve the settlement of this case to avoid a potential adverse jury verdict and award of further statutorily authorized attorney's fees and costs.

Plaintiff alleged that she was awarded a workplace accommodation under the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Rehabilitation Act and the Maryland Declaration of Rights to work at BPD's Quartermaster Unit in a light duty capacity. Plaintiff further alleged that BPD violated and revoked her accommodation when it transferred her to Building Security Unit located at BPD Headquarters and then retaliated against her when she was ultimately separated from service because she exceeded the maximum time period to return to full duty status. While the defendants vehemently deny any wrongdoing, given the department's policy prohibiting permanent light duty and its obligation to separate members who exceed the maximum time period permitted under the FOP and City labor MOU, it is expected that the City would incur significant fees and costs as a direct result of the trial in this case, if it were not settled at this stage.

To mitigate costly trial expenses and the prospect of a potentially substantial jury award, and mindful of the uncertainties and risks associated with an adverse judgment at trial, the BPD and the City have reached an agreement to offer the plaintiff a total settlement of \$200,000.00 to resolve the case entirely. In return, Plaintiff Williams has agreed to dismiss her lawsuit against all Defendants with prejudice.
