BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Ken Malone is a co-founder of Early Charm Ventures, LLC a venture studio founded in 2012 after relocating from Mississippi to Baltimore due to the research that Baltimore's universities provided. Early Charm converts science to business by specializing in taking brilliant scientific discoveries made at universities and turning them into companies focused on growth. Their goal is to build companies that create sustainable value.

Their best successes come from teaming with entrepreneurial-minded faculty who are rooted in drug design, custom materials, aquaculture technologies, and machine vision.

Prior to forming Early Charm, Malone had careers in the heavy chemical industry working for Georgia Gulf Corporation and Atochem, and in academia working for the University of Southern Mississippi. He has a Ph.D. in polymer science and engineering (Southern Miss) and a BS in biochemistry and chemistry (U Miami).

Their recent expansion into 1300 Bayard Street, is driven by their needs to manufacture advanced materials including 3D printed plastic, metal, ceramic and biologic parts, nanofiber filters, membranes and textiles, flexible electronic components, and flame-retardant textile inks. It will also allow us an expanded footprint for assembled devices production. Many of these products started as ideas at local universities.

EC will be creating at least 115 full time positions at the project site, by December 31, 2027.

Proposed City Assistance:

BDC recommends that the City provide financial assistance in the form of a One Hundred Thousand Dollar (\$100,000) convertible loan to assist the Company with manufacturing equipment. If all of the Performance Criteria are met over the term, all outstanding deferred principal and accrued interest will be forgiven at the end of the loan term. If any of the Performance Criteria are not met, the Loan would be repayable.

The Company must meet the following Performance Criteria over the term of the loan: <u>The Company will employ at least 115 full-time permanent employees at the Project Site at all times during the term of the loan.</u>

Full-time permanent employment will be measured annually as of December 31st of each calendar year, with employment reports due to BDC by February 28th of the following year. The Company must employ a minimum of 115 employees at the project Site by December 31, 2027 and maintain at least 115 employees for, 2027, 2028, 2029, 2030, and 2031.

If the Annual Full Time Employee Count for any of the years 2027, 2028, 2029, 2030 and 2031 is less than one hundred and fifteen (115), then not later than ninety (90) days after the end of that year, the Company shall pay to the City of Baltimore Development Corporation (a fee) the sum of (A) \$87.00 times the difference between 115 and the annual full time employee count of that year and (B) interest at 3% per annum on the then outstanding amount of the entire \$100,000 funding.

If the annual full-time employee count for any of the years ,2027, 2028, 2029, 2030, and 2031 is equal to or greater than one hundred and fifteen (115), then for that year, the amount of \$20,000.00 of the principal amount of the funding plus accrued and unpaid interest shall be forgiven.

State Participation:

The Maryland Department of Commerce through its MEEDAF program will be providing a Four Hundred and Sixty Thousand (\$460,000) forgivable loan, which requires by law, a 10 percent match minimum by the local jurisdiction.

BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Bill 22-0214 proposes to grant a franchise to The Johns Hopkins Hospital (JHH) to install and maintain, in connection with certain facilities, an underground Snow Melt System in the sidewalk of the 1700 block of East Monument Street. The utilities will be constructed, used, and maintained at the expense of JHH.

The snow melt, heat board system, is designed to melt snow during storms. The system is basically composed of three components: a heating cable, a control unit, and an activation device. The system can help extend the life of concrete and asphalt, as well as reduce the use of salt. All terms and conditions are outlined in the bill. The bill will become effective on the date of enactment. If granted, the franchise must be executed and enjoyed within 6 months of the effective date of the ordinance. The initial term of the franchise is one (1) year. The franchise would renew automatically for twenty-four (24) consecutive 1-year renewal terms. The maximum term of the franchise is 25 years. The Mayor and City Council, acting through the Department of Public Works, may terminate the franchise after giving written notice 90 days prior to the end of the 1-term renewal terms. The Board of Estimates has the authority to determine a franchise fee.

This bill was introduced by the City Council President (Administration) on April 4, 2023. It was voted out of committee favorably on February 28, 2023.

The Department of Transportation has recommended the yearly fee be \$70.30.

The District also has a Board of Directors which prepares the annual operating budget and manages funds received from a property tax surcharge. Property tax surcharges are approved by property owners within the District's boundaries. The District currently consists of 361 total properties, 337 of which are taxable and 24 that are not taxable. The Fiscal 2023 estimated revenue generated from surcharges is \$3,228,242. BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

The factual findings and disciplinary recommendations are fully detailed in the attached memorandum. MWBOO set goals of 13% MBE and 5% WBE on Department of Public Works (DPW) WC 1403 Urgent Need Infrastructure Rehabilitation and Improvements Phase II-FY20. Economic International Construction Company, Inc. (EICCI) committed via an executed Statement of Intent to serve as MBE subcontractor to prime contractor Metra Industries (Metra) on WC 1403. Metra was found to be compliant with the requirements of the MWB Program, codified in Baltimore City Code Article 5, Subtitle 28. WC 1403 was awarded to Metra by the Board on February 12, 2020. At the time of the award, there were concerns raised by MWBOO to the Board regarding Metra's failure to achieve compliance with M/WBEs goals on their existing contracts.

Metra submitted a request for the substitution of EICCI as their MBE subcontractor on May 9, 2022 asserting that they had "encountered a partial unavailability by one of our Subcontractors – EICCI." Metra further stated that cost increases led to the inability to continue with EICCI and that they were seeking to substitute for M. Luis. Metra did not acknowledge that EICCI was willing to continue work on WC 1403 if the outstanding balance owed to them was satisfied. Metra's substitution request stated that the EICCI unavailability was due solely to cost increases. EICCI stated in a May 26, 2022 email, that was not provided to MWBOO until their October complaint, that they were willing to continue work on the contract, but were seeking to have the outstanding invoices satisfied.

DPW advised that they would not move forward due to problems with payments to contractors and the uncertainty as to who would serve as the MBE subcontractor on this contract following the requested approval for the change order. DPW has worked in partnership throughout the investigation of the facts and circumstances surrounding WC 1403. DPW on June 15, 2022 informed Metra that they would not process additional estimates without a signed acknowledgement from EICCI acknowledging that all outstanding invoices have been paid.

MWBOO began investigating this matter at the time the substitution request was requested.MWBOO was initially concerned regarding the status of payments to EICCI and whether EICCI was aware of the proposed substitution. MWBOO engaged in meetings and discussions with Metra for months. Metra was unable to provide any documentation that EICCI had been promptly paid for their completed work nor could they provide written documentation

of EICCI's acknowledgment of the substitution. EICCI subsequently lodged a written complaint on October 24, 2022 to DPW and MWBOO where they relayed that they were not refusing to perform work, that they had been unsuccessful in attempts to contact Metra for payment, and that "Metra Industries should not be awarded any new contracts until they fulfill their financial obligations to ALL their contracted MBE/WBE." EICCI's complaint allegations were added to the scope of the investigation of WC 1403.

MWBOO was in communication with Metra via email and phone conferences throughout the fall of 2022. MWBOO relayed in those meetings that the pending WC 1403 substitution and change order would not move forward until all outstanding M/WBE payments were satisfied.DPW also reiterated the need to pay EICCI for all outstanding invoices on multiple occasions. Metra did not make payment to EICCI until December 15, 2022.In their December 15th email Metra stated, "Metra has very good news to report in support of / favor of passing the WC 1403 Change Order so Urgent Need Work can be expedited, approving our MBE substitution request and otherwise. We are paying up EICCI all open invoices we have from them on that job." (Emphasis in original). Metra did make payment in full to EICCI for WC 1403 via overnight check. Those invoices were dated: September 4, 2020, December 3, 2021, February 8, 2022, March 4, 2022, April 5, 2022, and May 5, 2022. In the email message informing DPW and MWBOO of this payment Metra detailed five, not six satisfied invoice payments to EICCI. Metra failed to include the September 4, 2020 Invoice 5118 in the message, the oldest outstanding invoice, but it was detailed on the check. EICCI was utilized and paid a total of \$558,287.40 for their work completed of the \$860,000 Statement of Intent commitment for WC 1403.

Invoice 5118 took over two years to be paid. Metra was paid for Estimate 5 inclusive of September 2020 work on November 16, 2020 \$357,582.90 and continued to be paid at least (9) nine additional times throughout 2021 without satisfying the payments to EICCI. Invoice 5183 took a year to be paid. Further, Metra was paid \$135,269.78 in February 2022 for Estimate 18 for December 2021 work, Nonetheless, the December 2021 Invoice 5183 remained outstanding until December 2022. This is despite these and additional April and May 2022 payments to Metra.

The additional June 2022 invoices 5188, 5192, 5193, and 5198 took at least a month and a half prior to being satisfied. WC 1403 Estimate 24 per Metra (work done in August) was acknowledged as paid via the November wire transfer \$249,102.38 via email. It is unclear when Metra was paid for the June invoices. It can be inferred from the correspondence that the June invoices, which predate Estimate 24 (work done in August), had been satisfied as it was not listed in the Metra correspondence as being outstanding at the time the Metra payment chain discussion begins on October 28, 2022.

MWBOO's investigation concluded that Metra repeatedly misrepresented the refusal of EICCI to work on the project; concealed the actual rationale, lack of payment, that EICCI stated was causing them to not continue work on the project; and the payment status to MBE subcontractor EICCI of outstanding invoices dating back to December 2021. The underlying request to

substitute EICCI was misleading in that it only relayed the requested price escalation and did not accurately reflect EICCI's position that they were merely unwilling to work without full payment of past owed funds. These misrepresentations continued throughout the process until MWBOO Chief specifically instructed them to ensure all M/WBE subcontractors were paid or the Change Order would not move forward for approval. Metra did not bring to light any funds owed to EICCI for previously completed work.

This is clearly an untimely payment that was not made to their MBE subcontractor within 7 days of Metra being paid by the City. It is irrefutable, based upon the record, that MBE subcontractor payments were not made until specifically prompted to do so, far in excess of the mandated 7-day prompt payment requirement. To the extent that payment was delayed from the City to Metra, it does not alleviate or alter the 7-day prompt payment requirements of the Code § 28-55(b). The prompt payment requirement mandates that the prime pay their M/WBE subcontractors within 7-days of being paid by the City. Furthermore, Metra was not candid in their repeated and extensive communications with DPW and MWBOO over the course of months regarding the alleged EICCI "refusal" and the existence of outstanding invoices dating back to December 3, 2021.

This is a very troubling fact pattern and not in accordance with the City code or contract. It was only when the overall contract funds, that would serve to benefit Metra, were at risk that they took seriously their Code and contractual obligation to pay their subcontractors. Metra was specifically told by DPW on June 15, 2022 that they "will not process an estimate for WC 1402 or 1403 until we have a signed acknowledgement from E.I.C.C.I. indicating ALL INVOICES HAS BEEN PAID." (Emphasis in original). Despite this clear message, Metra took six months from the date of that message to send payment to EICCI. The pattern of behavior exhibited during the performance of contract WC 1403 shows an utter disregard for the MWB Program requirements.

MWBOO's findings and recommendation were submitted to DPW Director Jason Mitchell. The lack of prompt payment to a MBE subcontractor and lack of candor with MWBOO cannot be resolved absent this referral to the BOE to impose penalties for noncompliance.

Recommendation

It has been brought to the attention of the BOE, via protests by M/WBEs, that Metra has had repeated issues with making payment and/or late payments to M/WBEs.Metra is an experienced prime that should be fully aware of the City's requirements regarding prompt payment. A contractor's prior performance history, utilization, and prompt payment of M/WBEs is of great consequence when awarding public City funds. All contractors are to meet the City Code and contract obligations regarding the MWB Program and must be held to those standards.

Pursuant to the Code, this Honorable Board may impose administrative penalties that are articulated in the Code, specifically:

CHAPTER 4 PENALTIES

§ 28-122. Administrative penalties.

A contractor who fails to comply with any provision of this subtitle is subject to any or all of the following penalties:

- (1) suspension of contract;
- (2) withholding of funds;
- (3) rescission of contract based on material breach;
- (4) refusal to accept a bid;
- (5) disqualification of a bidder, contractor, or other business from eligibility for providing good or services to the City for a period not to exceed 2 years; and
- (6) payment of liquidated damages.

MWBOO respectfully recommends that this Honorable Board:

- 1. rescind WC1403 based upon a material breach of the Minority and Women's Business Program requirements mandating prompt payment to M/WBE subcontractors;
- 2. Metra's eligibility to provide the City with goods or services for two (2) years;
- 3. the payment of liquidated damages in an amount determined to be appropriate by the Board; and
- 4. additional penalties that the Board determines.

This is merely a recommendation from MWBOO. The Board may subject Metra to any or all of the Code § 28-122 penalties detailed above. This action will enable WC 1403, and any other contracts where Metra is the prime contractor, to be rebid and awarded to another prime contractor who will comply with all of the requirements of the MWB Program. We must demand more from our contractors. Primes contractors should not be rewarded with additional contract dollars and bid opportunities if they do not fulfill their obligations to M/WBE subcontractors. Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

There are facts that present risks to the City should this matter go to trial. The nature of the appearance of the missing brick as well as construction work in the area at the time related to replacement of City water mains raise questions as to whether the City had notice of a defective walkway. While the notice issue is not a certainty either way, the fact that Plaintiff Harris sustained a serious injury with significant medical bills makes this settlement prudent for the City, as we have been able to reach an agreement on an amount less than the total dollar amount of Plaintiff's medical bills (which are documented to be \$45,193.47).

In order to resolve this litigation economically and to avoid the expense, time and uncertainties of further protracted litigation, the City has agreed to offer Plaintiff payment of \$29,000 for complete settlement of the case in return for dismissal of the claim against the City.

Based on a review by the Settlement Committee of the Law Department of the legal and factual issues specific to this particular claim, a recommendation to the Board of Estimates is made to approve the settlement of this claim in order to avoid a potential adverse jury verdict.

Charles Streets. Although the City had not received 311 complaints about this condition, there was no question that it had existed for a significant period of time and posed a hazard. Thus, the City could be deemed to have been on constructive notice of this condition prior to Plaintiff's fall.

LTYC is a provider of fine arts programming in elementary and secondary schools throughout Maryland, and it has worked with the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioner ("BCBSC") in various capacities since 2009. LTYC hires artists as independent contractors who report directly to schools and provide programs for students to practice performance art, visual arts, and other artistic programs.

In October of 2019, LTYC's existing contract expired and BCBSC declined LTYC's application for a new contract. Without a valid contract, LTYC had to discontinue its operations with City Schools in the middle of the 2019-2020 school year. As a result, at least twelve LTYC contractors could not continue arts programming that was underway, which left principals scrambling to find programming during periods slated for fine art instruction. Principals used their discretionary budgets to hire temporary staff to fill the scheduling voids, and in some cases, principals directly hired the LTYC independent contractor who had been working in their school. LTYC claimed that BCBSC wrongfully declined their application for a new contract and then intentionally induced twelve of LTYC's independent contractors to breach their contracts by transitioning to employment directly with BCBSC.

In order to avoid the expense, time, and uncertainties of a large jury trial, the City and City Schools agreed to make settlement payment of \$50,000.00 to LTYC. The settlement is also contingent upon LTYC's reinstatement as a vendor with City Schools, which was approved by BCBSC on February 14, 2022, consistent with its procurement processes. In exchange, LTYC agreed to a full release of all claims against BCBSC, including any claims for attorney's fees. Documentation of BCBSC's approval is available online.
