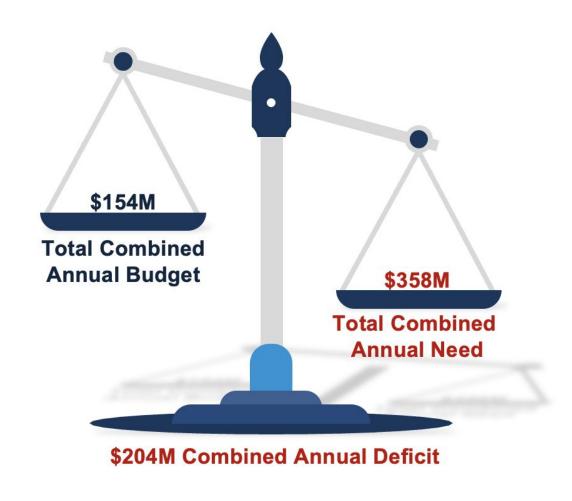

1. Facility Conditions + Investments | Current Landscape

The current maintenance and capital budget is approximately \$204M <u>less</u> than what is needed.

Given the City Schools building portfolio, it would require a combined \$358M of capital and maintenance funding to upgrade and maintain District buildings to industry standards.





1. Facility Conditions + Investments | County Comparisons

Other jurisdictions get more funding.

Neighboring wealthier jurisdictions receive more funds from the IAC and their local jurisdiction, the latter of which Baltimore City is unable to do. Below are the approximate FY24 Capital funds per IAC Allocations and County Budgets, in millions:

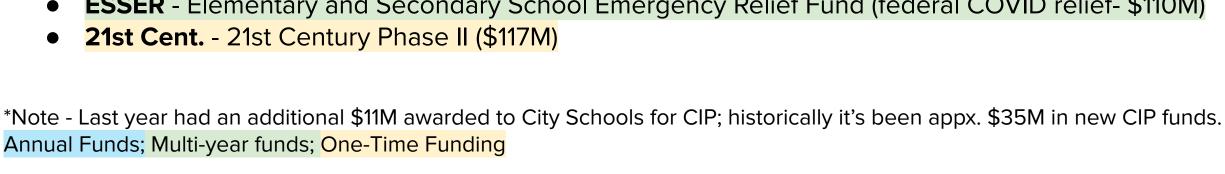
The majority of City Schools capital funds come from the State.

State Funds

- **CIP -** Capital Improvement Program (\$ ~35-46M*)
- **HSFF** Healthy School Facility Funds (\$45M)
- BtL Built to Learn (\$357M)
- PTG SB291 Pass Through Grant (\$75M)

Non State Funds include:

- **Local** Baltimore City (\$19M)
- **ESSER** Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (federal COVID relief- \$110M)





2. Funding Sources | Capital Decisions

Capital decisions are informed by both physical system conditions and District priorities.

Physical Systems: inspections and PM (Preventative Maintenance) reports, FCI (Facilities Condition Index), work orders, lifecycle information

District Priorities: Annual Review decisions, CEFMP (Comprehensive Educational Facilities Master Plan) and CMP (Comprehensive Maintenance Plan) data and analysis, and state initiatives



3. Summary of Projects | Projects Requested for FY25 CIP

We carry over projects that have multiple years of funding.

We then pull out anything that can be covered by HSFF.

Add systems projects where our CMMS (Computerized Maintenance Management System) has flagged an item as nearing the end of its life cycle/has needed so much repair that it's in our interest to replace it.

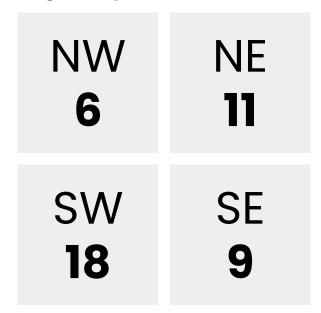

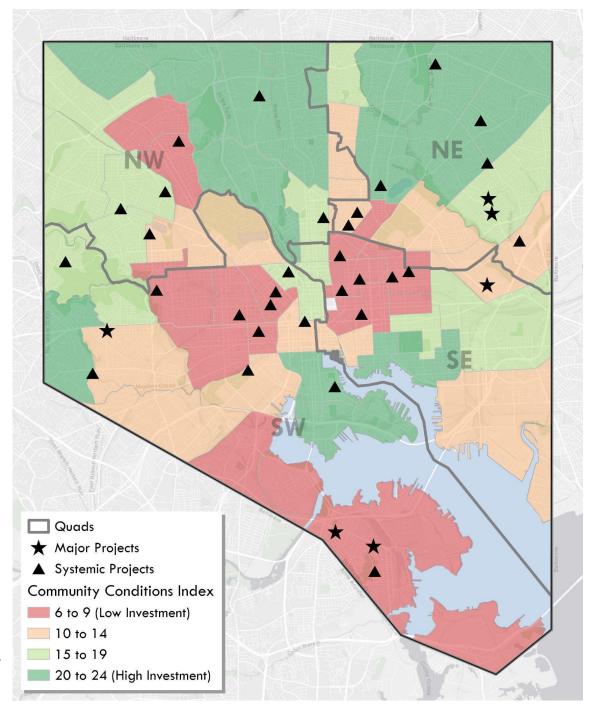

Appendix | State Funding

Current cost share is 94%, slated to go down to 91% next year. Additional future decreases are a possibility. There are opportunities to increase that cost share, but this doesn't change the overall amount of funding we are slated to receive.

Concentration of Poverty (COP)

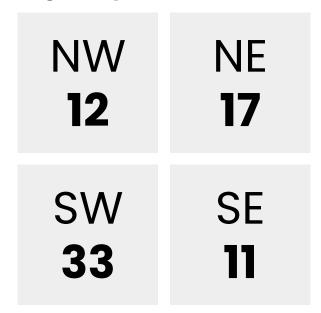

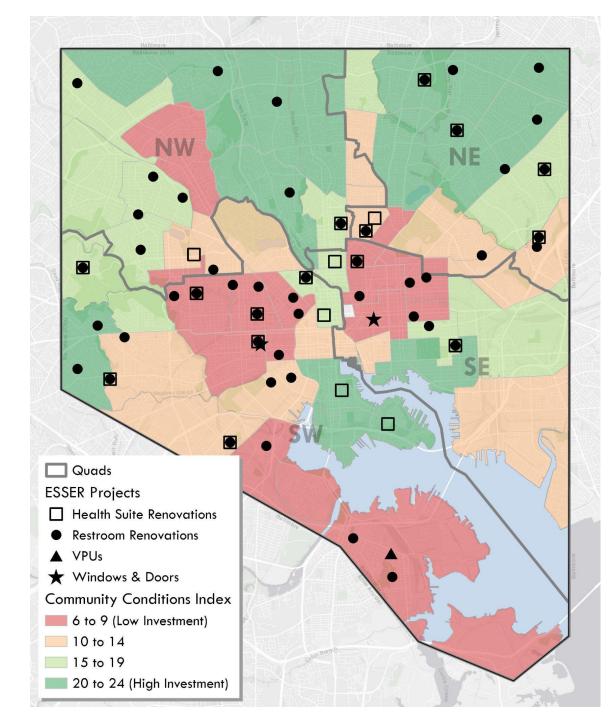

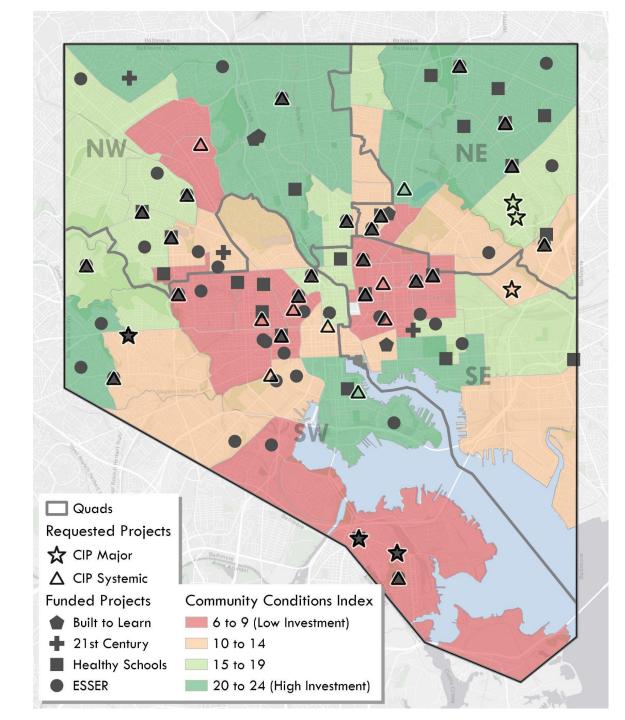

FY21 and FY22 - \$866K - Emergency egress plans, one card access, 4 secure vestibules FY23 - approx \$900k - support for security work projects



HVAC FUNDS

\$15M over 7 years - Funds used for design, construction, and capital equipment of HVAC improvement (one time fund with all but one project complete)

MAGGIE MCINTOSH ARTS CENTER (MMAC) GRANT

Grant provided for the acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of art spaces
