SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES OF BALTIMORE CITY RELATING TO COST ESCALATION CHANGE ORDERS DUE TO ADVERSE ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

- WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Estimates ("Board"), pursuant to Article VI, Section 11 (a) of the Charter of Baltimore City, 2022 Edition, as amended, ("Charter") is responsible for awarding contracts and supervising all purchasing by the City; and
- WHEREAS, supply chain disruptions and high inflation as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic as well as the ongoing war in Ukraine continue to significantly increase costs of labor, materials, supplies, and equipment for contractors ("adverse economic conditions"); and
- WHEREAS, contractors on awarded City construction projects have requested change orders to reduce the adverse economic impact on their businesses from the supply chain disruptions and high inflation; and
- WHEREAS, City contracts do not contain escalation clauses to address adverse economic conditions such as supply chain disruptions and high inflation; and
- WHEREAS, rebidding contracts, cancelling projects, or pursuing legal actions against contractors that will not perform due to the adverse economic conditions may be detrimental to the City in comparison to negotiating change orders; and
- WHEREAS, the Board does have broad discretion to approve change orders related to adverse economic conditions; and
- **WHEREAS**, by Resolution adopted by the Board on December 7, 2022 (the "December Resolution"), the Board created a process pursuant to which City agencies may request change orders due to adverse economic conditions for contracts awarded prior to July 1, 2022; and
- **WHEREAS**, the December Resolution originally terminated on June 30, 2023, subject to extension of the term by the Board; and
- **WHEREAS**, on June 21, 2023, the Board Amended the December Resolution to provide that the December Resolution termination date was amended to June 30, 2024, subject to extension of the term by the Board; and
- **WHEREAS**, the December Resolution, as amended, terminates on June 30, 2024, subject to extension of the term by the Board; and
- **WHEREAS**, the need for the City to consider the impact of adverse economic conditions on City contracts continues and necessitates the extension of the effective term of the December Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES OF BALTIMORE CITY, that the December Resolution is hereby amended as follows:

A. Section IV: "Effective Date" and REPLACE with the following new

"This Resolution shall take effect upon the date of approval by the Board of Estimates and end June 30, 2024, unless further extended by the Board of Estimates. Any complete requests for change orders due to adverse economic conditions ("Cost Escalation Packages") submitted to the City agencies and accepted by such City agencies for processing by June 30, 2024 will be allowed to be considered for approval."

B. Except as amended by this Second Amendment, the December Resolution remains in full force and effect.
