On December 15, 2020, the Board of Estimates approved a Resolution of the Board of Estimates Relating to Abstentions. In accordance with that resolution, I will be abstaining on the following items.

P. 26 - Health – Agreement – Johns Hopkins University - The Johns Hopkins University's Bayview Medical Center will conduct surveillance, screening and treatment services, and provide health promotion and prevention education.

P. 27 - Health – Agreement – Johns Hopkins University - The Board is requested to approve and authorize execution of an Agreement with Johns Hopkins University. The period of the Agreement is July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. Johns Hopkins University will provide limited short-term assistance to support emergency, temporary, or traditional housing or utility assistance to enable a client or family to gain or maintain outpatient ambulatory health services.

P. 76-77 - Bureau of Procurement – Johns Hopkins University - The requested action is a report on an emergency procurement. An outbreak of disease (COVID-19) caused by the novel coronavirus has been detected in the United States with cases in Baltimore, MD. The World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control have declared the COVID-19 outbreak a public health emergency of international concern; the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services declared COVID-19 a public health emergency. Both Mayor Bernard C. "Jack" Young and Governor Hogan declared a state of emergency. Current Mayor, Brandon Scott also agrees with this measure.
